Dear friends,

How have you all been doing during the lockdown? Did you know that people's interest in pets went up so much during this time, that pet food costs increased by 20%? Pets make great companions!

Let me tell you about my experiences with my pet snails. Yes, you read it right – snails for pets. I never liked snails that much, but photographed them, whenever I saw one.

It was only when one appeared in my money plant (that my dad brought home from the plant nursery), that I started to like him very much. He was moving surprisingly fast for snails and was very interesting to watch! I wanted to take care of him, but sadly, he died the next day. (We found out later that it could be because of pesticide sprayed on the plant).



After that, I read many articles about snails – the different kinds of snails, if they could be pets, where to keep them, what to feed them, etc. Garden snails seemed to be really popular with kids!

So, my dad brought home 2 snails from the same plant nursery. I named them Buddy and Slider. Slider was named that way since he loved to climb the jar that I kept him in! I then moved them to a plastic fish tank with sand spread on the floor and stones to climb on. I sprayed them with water regularly and fed them vegetables like cabbage, carrots, cucumbers, mushrooms and fruits (washed with water, to remove pesticides).

We became good friends!

I kept reading articles and was trying to figure out what species they were. Snails belong to the family of gastropod mollusks and mine were terrestrial or land snails. It was a few months later that I realized that they were horntail snails (Macrochlamys Indica). Interestingly these snails are very active after rains and can withdraw into their shells and stay inactive (this is called 'aestivation') when humidity decreases until the next rainy season.

However, I also found out that they could carry parasites that could cause dangerous illnesses like meningitis in humans. I therefore decided to put them away, since my parents advised it. I do miss them. But I hope I will be able to learn more about their fascinating lives perhaps when I grow up.

JALLIKATTU

allikattu comes from the Tamil term 'Salli Kassu' which means coins and kattu which means package tied to the horns of bulls as prize money.

Jallikattu, is a popular bull taming sport held during Pongal. It is set to take place in Madurai district. The three main venue where the sport will take place are Palamedu, Alanganallur and Avainaipuram. Preparations have started for the conduct of jallikattu, involving the departments of police, animal husbandry, public works, revenue, district administration and local organising committees.

The sport requires fighters to pounce on a running bull try to hold on to its hump and move along with the animal without falling or getting hurt. It requires quick reflexes and a fleet foot to tame the bull, which will try to get away, shake off the fighter and at times stamp or gore the fallen participants.

Jallikattu is a dated tradition. An ancient reference to bull taming is found in a seal discovered at Mohenjadaro, which is dated between 25000 BC and 1800 BC. The sport was called "Eru thazuvual" or "embracing the bull".

On 7th May 2014, the supreme court of India struck down the state law and banned jallikattu altogether. The Supreme Court noted that any flouting of the ban should result in penalties for cruelty to animals under "The prevention of cruelty to Animal's Act 1960". The WHO also demanded a ban on PETA in India.

In 2017, Tamil Nadu saw massive popular protests demanding that the centre and the Tamil Nadu government take legal steps to hold jallikattu.
